Cordless Dual-Handset Phone Programming and Operating Instructions

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS AND USAGE TIPS

Please refer to the following specifications for use of the Panasonic® cordless interpreter telephones provided by Pacific Interpreters™. The original packaging of the cordless telephone unit contains additional information on specifications.

Power Requirements

You will need access to two power outlets to plug in your cordless phone. The handsets also come equipped with NiMh rechargeable batteries.

Telephone Line

The cordless phone uses an analog phone line.

Signal Quality

Utilizing DECT 6.0 PLUS and Frequency Hopping Spread Spectrum (FHSS) technologies, the Panasonic cordless phone provides excellent sound clarity and long-range signal processing that minimizes interference with sensitive equipment.

Speakerphone Option

There is a speakerphone option on each handset labeled [SP-PHONE]. While speakerphones can be extremely convenient, please be aware that the background noise picked up by a speakerphone can impact sound quality on your interpreting call.

Locator Button

Lost a handset? It's easy to do! There is a handy [LOCATOR] button on the telephone base unit that will make the handset beep to help you locate it.

Cordless Dual-Handset Phone Programming and Operating Instructions


USING THE SHARED PHONEBOOK

The shared phonebook enables you to make calls without having to manually dial. Any handset registered to the base unit can use the shared phonebook. You can add 50 names and phone numbers to the shared phonebook. Please note the following:

- Your toll-free number to access a language interpreter through Pacific Interpreters will be the only pre-programmed number in the phone book when you receive your telephone.
- Only one person can access the shared phonebook at a time.





Adding Entries

To add an entry to the shared phonebook, complete the following steps for handset #1 (there is a "1" in the top right corner of the handset screen). Once you have completed the steps, changes will automatically transfer to handset #2.

1. Press [].
2. Press [▼] / [▲], "Add new entry" and press [OK].
3. Enter the party's name (16 character maximum) and press [OK]. To switch between upper and lowercase letters, press [*].
4. Enter the party's phone number and press [OK], then press [OK] again to save the addition.
5. Press [OFF].

Finding and Calling a Phonebook Entry

You can locate and call an entry by scrolling or searching through the phonebook:

- **Scroll Through Entries:**
 1. Press [].
 2. Press [▼] / [▲] to select the desired entry.
 3. Press [].
- **Search by first character:**
 1. Press [].
 2. Press the dial key ([0] – [9]), which contains the character for which you are searching (e.g., [2] contains a, b, and c).
 - Press the same dial key repeatedly to display the first entry corresponding to each character located on that dial key.
 3. Once you have located the entry, press [].

Correcting a Mistake

To correct a data entry mistake:

1. Press [◀] or [▶] to move the cursor to the character or number you want to erase.
2. Press [CLEAR].
3. Enter the appropriate character or number.
4. Press and hold [CLEAR] to erase all characters or numbers typed.
